
258-4  **Economy and crime top voters concern** (Click for Details)

An average of 26% of Americans said they were satisfied with the way things were going in the United States in 2012, an improvement from 17% in 2011. Still, satisfaction remains depressed compared with the historical average of 38%. (Gallup USA)

## Topic of the week:

### **Leaders Job Approval**

- This page is devoted to opinions of countries whose polling activity is generally not known very widely or where a recent topical issue requires special attention.



This report includes the leaders' job approval part of "Leaders' Reputations and Public Trust in Institutions" survey.

The survey is conducted among 1202 individuals in urban and rural areas of 31 cities including Adana, Ağrı, Ankara, Antalya, Aydın, Bursa, Çanakkale, Diyarbakır, Erzurum, Eskişehir, Gaziantep, Hatay, Mersin, İstanbul, İzmir, Kastamonu, Kayseri, Kırıkkale, Kocaeli, Konya,

Malatya, Manisa, Mardin, Muğla, Ordu, Osmaniye, Samsun, Tekirdağ, Trabzon, Van and Zonguldak between 26 November – 01 December 2012.

CATI (Computer Assisted Telephone Interviewing) system is used with gender, age, and residence area quota application. The margin of error for the overall poll is +/- 2,8 percentage points, at a 95 percent confidence level.



### The President's Overall Job Performance


The research data shows that the President is supported by public substantially. The percentage of respondents, who approve the way Abdullah Gül is carrying out his job as a President, is 76%. There is a 5 point decrease in this evaluation in comparison to December 2011 survey results.

The mean score of Abdullah Gül's overall job performance is 7,3 out of 10.

### Prime Minister's Overall Job Performance


The 59% of respondents approve of Prime Minister's overall job performance, while the 35% of them do not approve. There is a 12 point decrease in comparison to December 2011 results.



### The score of R. Tayyip Erdoğan's Overall Job Performance

The mean score of R.Tayyip Erdoğan's overall job performance is 6,5 out of 10. In December 2011 it was 7,1.

### A Quantitative Analysis

A quantitative analysis of global polls monitored during the 4 year period January 2007 – January 2013

#### KEY STATISTICS

- 1- Number of Surveys (*a selection on key political and social issues*):  $\approx$  6,805 polls during the period 2007-2013
- 2- Subjects of Interest (*we have made a list of 125 subjects, further grouped into 9 broad categories, namely: **Governance**, **Globalization** (inclusive of global economic issues) **Global Conflicts** (conflict zones), **Global leaders** (USA and Emerging powers), **Global Environment**, **Family**, **Religion**, and **other miscellaneous***)
- 3- Number of **countries** covered by one or more surveys:  $\approx$  178 during the period 2007-2013
- 4- Number **polling organizations** whose polls have been cited:  $\approx$  358 during the period 2007-2013
