([Palestine](#)) A recent poll shows that half (50.5%) of the Palestinian people consider the Palestinian Authority's decision to resume negotiations with Israel was a wrong decision compared with 33.8% that considered it a right decision. This seems to be in harmony with the majority, 68.7% which said that the negotiations would not succeed in reaching an agreement with Israel, compared with 20.8% who said they would succeed. (JMCC)

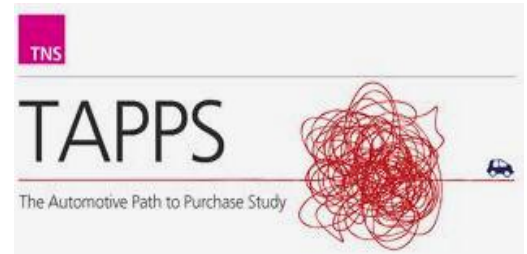
304-5 **Bloated Chinese auto market gives rise to the super savvy shopper** (Click for Details)

(Russia) Nearly one quarter of Russians acknowledged that they have no particular hobbies or interests. All the other Russians putting their leisure time to good use. One reads for pleasure, others frequent movie theaters or dramatic/musical theaters. Among other most popular hobbies mentioned were fishing and hunting (among men) and crafts (among women). On average, those who do have some kind of hobby devote about 6 hours a week to it. On average, people spend about 18 thousand RUB a year on their interests. Over the recent eight years the public opinion about the opposition has changed. The share of those who believe that the opposition should set its political course and coming to power has increased from 29 to 40%. The Economist/Ipsos MORI November Issues index shows that, though the general economy is still the most important issue facing Britain today, mentioned by two fifths (40%) of the public as amongst the most important issues, this is the lowest level of concern since June 2008, as the financial crisis started to take shape. 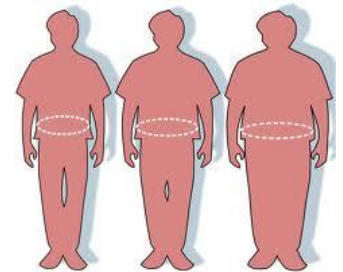

Suffering, on average, has increased worldwide in the past several years, and nowhere more than in South Asia. One in seven adults worldwide rated their lives poorly enough to be considered suffering in 2012. South

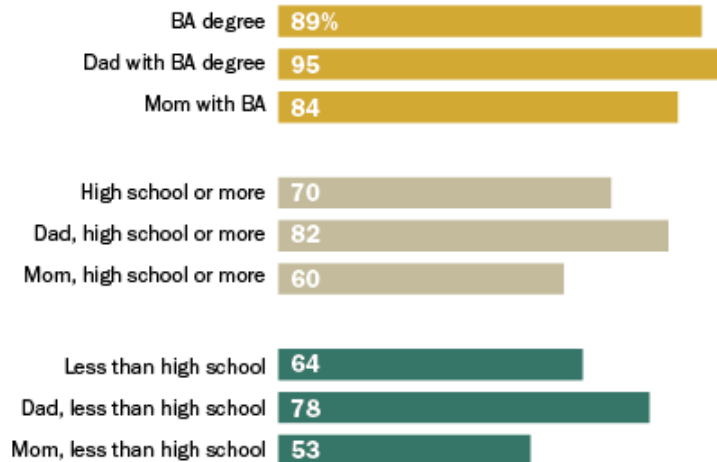

Marriage has been on the decline for decades, particularly for those with less education. At the same time, the share of non-marital births for the less educated has risen dramatically, and the likelihood of divorce remains significantly higher among those lacking a college degree than among those who have one.

Not only is there an educational gap in the likelihood of parents living with their minor children being married, but there is a gender gap as well.

Just over half (53%) of mothers who lack a high school diploma and who live with their children are married, as compared with 78% of dads with the same educational level. These gender differences narrow considerably — but still persist — among the most educated. Some 84% of moms who have a bachelor's degree and live with their children are married, compared with 95% of dads with a bachelor's degree.

These gender gaps are largely driven by differences in the patterns of single parenting. While the share of single parents who are dads has risen dramatically, it's still the case that most single parents are moms.

And since divorce and non-marital births are more prevalent among the less educated, that means single parents — particularly single moms — are more prevalent, as well. Approximately 30% of moms with less than a college degree who live with their kids are living without a spouse or partner, as compared with 7% of comparable dads. In comparison, 13% of college-educated moms who live with their kids are living without a spouse or partner, as are 3% of comparable dads.

KEY STATISTICS

- 1- Number of Surveys (*a selection on key political and social issues*): \approx 6,805 polls during the period 2007-2013
- 2- Subjects of Interest (*we have made a list of 125 subjects, further grouped into 9 broad categories, namely: **Governance**, **Globalization** (inclusive of global economic issues) **Global Conflicts** (conflict zones), **Global leaders** (USA and Emerging powers), **Global Environment**, **Family**, **Religion**, and **other miscellaneous***)
- 3- Number of **countries** covered by one or more surveys: \approx 178 during the period 2007-2013
- 4- Number **polling organizations** whose polls have been cited: \approx 358 during the period 2007-2013
