(USA) President Barack Obama wrapped up 2013 with an average 41% approval rating in December, unchanged from November. However, his monthly job approval declined steadily through most of 2013, including a three-percentage-point drop in March. (Gallup USA)

Uninsured Americans who have visited a health insurance exchange website mostly say their experience was negative rather than positive, by 59% to 39%. That reading, from Gallup Daily tracking throughout December,

is only a slight improvement from Gallup's combined October and November polling, when 63% reported a negative experience and 33% a positive one. (Gallup USA)

309-12 **U.S. Economic Confidence Rising, but Still Negative** (Click for Details)

(USA) The Gallup Economic Confidence Index averaged -17 last week, significantly improved from the -39 found in mid-October during the federal government shutdown. But the index remains stuck in negative territory at the end of 2013 and is considerably below the peak of -3 measured in early June. (Gallup USA)

309-13 **Obama, Clinton Continue Reign as Most Admired** (Click for Details)

For the sixth consecutive year, Barack Obama ranks as the Most Admired Man among Americans, and Hillary Clinton is again the Most Admired Woman. Both won by comfortable margins. Sixteen percent named Obama, compared with 4% each for former President George W. Bush and Pope Francis; Clinton (15%) finished ahead of television personality Oprah Winfrey (6%), first lady Michelle Obama (5%), and former Alaska Gov. Sarah Palin (5%). (Gallup USA)

According to a new Pew Research Center analysis, six-in-ten Americans (60%) say that "humans and other living things have evolved over time," while a third (33%) reject the idea of evolution, saying that "humans and other living things have existed in their present form since the beginning of time." 309-16 **Worldwide, Richest 3% Hold One-Fifth of Collective Income** (Click for Details)

Across 131 countries worldwide, the richest 3% of residents hold 20% of the total collective household income -- as do the poorest 54%. In other words, the 3% reporting the highest household incomes share the same "slice" of collective income across countries that more than half of residents worldwide -- those on the lower end of the income scale -- must share. Income inequality levels are highest in sub-Saharan Africa and East Asia (predominantly China). (Gallup USA)

309-17 **Social Media Update 2013** (Click for Details)

Some 73% of online adults now use a social networking site of some kind. Facebook is the dominant social networking platform in the number of users, but a striking number of users are now diversifying onto other platforms. Some 42% of online adults now use multiple social networking sites. In addition, Instagram users are nearly as likely as Facebook users to check in to the site on a daily basis. These are among the key findings on social networking site usage and adoption from a new survey from the Pew Research Center's Internet Project. (Pew Research Center)

Fieldwork: 3 - 17 September 2013



A new international survey across 19 countries by Ipsos MORI shows that Britain is by far the most concerned about immigration control. 43% of people in Britain choose immigration control as one of the top 3 most important issues facing the country, with the next highest country being Australia on 32%.

All the other European countries included in the study – who also face the possibility of increased immigration from Romania and Bulgaria from 1st January – are much less concerned. For example, only 22% of Germans placed immigration control in their top 3 national issues, 21% in France, 17% in Italy and 6% in Spain.



This pattern is very consistent with previous studies we've conducted: Britain has been the most concerned country every single month since we started tracking views internationally in 2009.

Bobby Duffy, Managing Director of the Ipsos MORI Social Research Institute said:

“This survey shows yet again that immigration control is much more of a focus in the UK than other countries. This concern has been consistently high over many years and is a real difference between the UK and other countries, including other countries in Europe, which have even fewer restrictions on freedom of movement for other European citizens.”

Technical details

The survey instrument was conducted in 20 countries via the Ipsos Online Panel system. For the results of the survey herein, a total sample of 16,039 adults age 18-64 in the US and Canada, and age 16-64 in all other countries, was interviewed between September 3rd and September 17th, 2013. Approximately 1000+ individuals were surveyed in Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, France, Germany, India, Italy, Japan, Spain, Great Britain and the United States of America. Approximately 500+ individuals were surveyed in Argentina, Belgium, Poland, Russia, South Africa, South Korea, Sweden and Turkey.

A Quantitative Analysis

A quantitative analysis of global polls monitored during the 5 year period January 2007 – January 2014

KEY STATISTICS

- 1- Number of Surveys (*a selection on key political and social issues*): \simeq 6,805 polls during the period 2007-2014
- 2- Subjects of Interest (*we have made a list of 125 subjects, further grouped into 9 broad categories, namely: **Governance**, **Globalization** (inclusive of global economic issues) **Global Conflicts** (conflict zones), **Global leaders** (USA and Emerging powers), **Global Environment**, **Family**, **Religion**, and **other miscellaneous***)
- 3- Number of **countries** covered by one or more surveys: \simeq 178 during the period 2007-2014
- 4- Number **polling organizations** whose polls have been cited: \simeq 358 during the period 2007-2014
