323-12 **After Decades of Decline, a Rise in Stay-at-Home Mothers** (Click for Details)

(USA) The share of mothers who do not work outside the home rose to 29% in 2012, up from a modern-era low of 23% in 1999, according to a new Pew Research Center analysis of government data. This rise over the past dozen years represents the reversal of a long-term decline in "stay-at-home" mothers that had persisted for the last three decades of the 20th century.² The recent turnaround appears to be driven by a mix of demographic, economic and societal factors, including rising immigration as well as a downturn in women's labor force participation, and is set against a backdrop of continued public ambivalence about the impact of working mothers on young children.

As Prosperity Rises In China, Sleep Quality Declines

► This page is devoted to opinions of countries whose polling activity is generally not known very widely or where a recent topical issue requires special attention.

March 21st was World Sleep Day. “Did you sleep well?” has once again become a hot question being asked among the public. The public-interest survey: 2014 China White Paper on Sleep Quality was officially launched in Huizhou. This survey was conducted by SOMNOPRO Sleep Research Center, Ipsos and the Sohu Health Channel.

Compared with thirty years ago, the sleep quality of Chinese people has been decreasing. There are now a growing number of contributors that might negatively affect sleep quality, including extreme life pressures, huge workloads, busy night life and noise pollution. Chinese now face additional risk factors such as “unsound diet and restless sleep”. These reasons are why SOMNOPRO is now running the public-interest survey on sleep quality for the third consecutive year.



During this survey, respondents were asked many questions that shed light on the concerns of the general Chinese public, including sleeping time, sleeping habits and factors affecting sleep quality. To present a true and full picture on sleep quality within China, a combination of specialized qualitative and quantitative research methods were introduced to conduct the survey. These included community listening and fixed-spot interviewing. This survey was conducted by sleep experts with the support of sample bases gathered by Ipsos and consumer databases from SOMNOPRO. “To take responsibility for the sleep health of the Chinese, we will rely on the media platform of Sohu.com, the surveying technologies of Ipsos and the 1,600-terminal network of SOMNOPRO across the nation to ensure an objective, scientific and professional survey” the staff from SOMNOPRO Sleep Research Center said.

The White Paper results will be released among the public in August 2014. By then it will be released by major media outlets to help raise more awareness on sleep health, to shed light on the science behind sleeping habits and help prevent sleep-related diseases from occurring.

A quantitative analysis of global polls monitored during the 5 year period January 2007 – January 2014

KEY STATISTICS

- 1- Number of Surveys (*a selection on key political and social issues*): \approx 6,805 polls during the period 2007-2014
- 2- Subjects of Interest (*we have made a list of 125 subjects, further grouped into 9 broad categories, namely: **Governance**, **Globalization** (inclusive of global economic issues) **Global Conflicts** (conflict zones), **Global leaders** (USA and Emerging powers), **Global Environment**, **Family**, **Religion**, and **other miscellaneous***)
- 3- Number of **countries** covered by one or more surveys: \approx 178 during the period 2007-2014
- 4- Number **polling organizations** whose polls have been cited: \approx 358 during the period 2007-2014
