

(USA) There were only three days in 2012 -- with one being the day of the Newtown school shooting -- when the percentage of Americans who reported experiencing a lot of happiness and enjoyment without a lot of stress and worry dropped below 40%. In comparison, happiness fell below 40% on 14 days in 2008 and 12 days in 2009. (Gallup USA)

261-13 Men, Married, Southerners Most Likely to Be Gun Owners (Click for Details)

Men are three times more likely than women to personally own guns, representing one of the largest demographic differences in gun ownership, according to an analysis of Gallup polls from 2007 to 2012. Gun ownership also varies significantly by region, with Southerners more likely to own guns than those living in other regions of the United States. Marriage is also a strong predictor of gun ownership. (Gallup USA) February 1, 2013

(USA) The nation's total immigrant population reached a record 40.4 million in 2011, according to an analysis of Census Bureau data by the Pew Hispanic Center, a project of the Pew Research Center. Over the last decade, the number of immigrants in the U.S. has steadily grown. Since 2007 alone, the number of immigrants living in the U.S. increased by 2.4 million. (Pew Research Center)

There were more blue states than red states in the U.S. in 2012, by a margin of 20 to 12. After the District of Columbia, the most Democratic-leaning states in 2012 were Hawaii, Maryland, Rhode Island, New York, and Massachusetts -- where Democrats held at least 20-percentage-point advantages in party identification. Republicans enjoyed this lopsided an advantage in Utah, Wyoming, and Idaho. (Gallup USA) January 30, 2013

American youth have little doubt that they will have a better life than their parents. Almost all fifth-through 12th-graders are optimistic about the future, saying they are very likely (43%) or somewhat likely (52%) to have a better standard of living, better homes, and a better education than their parents. A combined 5% of young people say the possibility of having a better life than their parents is somewhat or very unlikely. (Gallup USA)

261-19 Party Views Diverge Most on U.S. Gun Policies (Click for Details)

Of 17 U.S. policy areas, gun laws spark the greatest difference between Republicans and Democrats in terms of their satisfaction with the nation's policies in each area. Fifty-nine percent of Republicans and 28% of Democrats are satisfied with U.S. gun laws, a difference of 31 percentage points. U.S. policies on crime, the state of race relations, and the quality of public education elicit the smallest differences in Republicans' and Democrats' satisfaction. (Gallup USA)

261-25 **Tablets spur news consumption** (Click for Details)

(UK) A plurality (42%) of tablet owners think that owning one of the devices either has increased or will increase their news consumption. Younger tablet owners are the most likely to read more news now that they own a tablet, with 54% of 18-24 year olds and 60% of 25-34 year olds anticipating an increase in news consumption. This is compared to 44% of 35-44 year olds, 38% of 45-54 year olds and just more than a quarter (27%) of the over 55s. (YouGov)

This page is devoted to opinions of countries whose polling activity is generally not known very widely or where a recent topical issue requires special attention.

Research from YouGov finds that the majority of Germans (58%) believe France is their most important strategic European partner, followed by the UK and Russia (both 5%). The strategic relationship is even more important to the French with three quarters (75%) stating that Germany is their country's most important partner.

The research comes on the 50-year anniversary of the 'Elysée Treaty' of Franco-German cooperation. However, there is a great disparity in knowledge about the agreement between the two nations as while over half (52%) of Germans know of the treaty, just a quarter (25%) of the French do.

Relationship more important to Germany

People in Germany put slightly greater stock in a good relationship between the countries than the French do. Three quarters (75%) of Germans agree on the importance of the Franco-German friendship for their country compared to just over two-thirds (68%) of people in France. There is a marked difference between different age groups in Germany about the significance of the accord, with 85% over-55s agreeing that it's important, a figure that decreases to 58% among 25-34 year-olds.

Economic and political importance

The research also looks into the most important facets of the relationship between the two countries. Economic cooperation came out top in France with seven in ten (70%) people stating its value compared to six in ten (60%) Germans. The political aspect of the partnership is most crucial to people in Germany with almost two thirds (64%) registering its importance, although it carries less weight in France (38%).

Additionally, 58% of both people in France and Germany believe nothing much will change in the

Additionally, 58% of both people in France and Germany believe nothing much will change in the relationship under Angela Merkel and François Hollande.



KEY STATISTICS

- 2- Subjects of Interest (we have made a list of 125 subjects, further grouped into 9 broad categories, namely: Governance, Globalization (inclusive of global economic issues) Global Conflicts (conflict zones), Global leaders (USA and Emerging powers), Global Environment, Family, Religion, and other miscellaneous
- 3- Number of countries covered by one or more surveys: ~ 178 during the period 2007-2013
- 4- Number polling organizations whose polls have been citied: \sim 358 during the period 2007-2013
