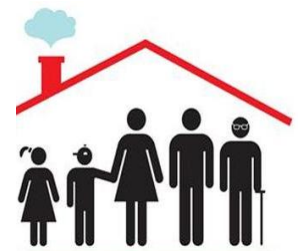

After The End of the World Cup, Rate Increases Dissatisfaction with Tournament¹



Research conducted by Datafolha Institute shows that the rate of dissatisfaction with the World Cup 2014 grew after the end of World. In comparison with the previous survey, conducted in early July, during the World Cup, the rate of voters who said that the World Cup has brought more harm than good for Brazilians increased eight percentage points, from 46% to 54%, while the rate those who hold the opinion that the event brought more benefits than losses fell nine points, from 45% to 36%. Already, the rate of which no answer has fluctuated, from 9% to 10%.



The survey also shows that most (68%) favors the replacement of Luiz Felipe Scolari in the selection is a Brazilian. Have to 23%, the new coach should be a foreigner and 9% did respond.

When presented with a list of the names of eight technicians to succeed Scolari in the Brazilian team, Tite was preferred by respondents, with 24% of mentions. A fifth (19%) chose Zico, 14% Muricy Ramalho, Carlos Alberto Parreira 6%, 6% Vanderlei Luxemburgo, 5% Mano Menezes, Marcelo Oliveira 2%, 2% and 18% Cuca no answer. To 5%, none of the technicians presented should be the new national coach.

Cai Approval Of Voters To The Government Of President Dilma Rousseff²

The approval of the government of President Dilma Rousseff has dropped three points since early July and is currently rated as excellent or good by 32% of Brazilian voters (versus 35% in a survey conducted on 1 and 2 July). The current index is closer to the level pre-World Cup (33% in the first week of June). The failure rate on the government of current president followed a similar trend: in early June, 28% considered bad management or bad, that rate dropped to 25% in the first week of July, PT and rose again, to 29% now. The portion of the electorate that evaluates the Dilma government as regular is 38%, stable compared with previous surveys index. There is still that 1% no opinion about the performance of the president.

The performance of Dilma is worse than that of his predecessors in the same period of the year that disputed reelection: for Lula (PT), Datafolha poll conducted between 17 and 18 July 2006 indicated 38% approval and disapproval 21%. The government of former President Fernando Henrique Cardoso (PSDB) was also approved by 38% in a survey conducted between 8 and July 9, 1998, and had the disapproval of 19%,



From 0 to 10, the average grade currently assigned to the Rousseff administration is 5.6, compared to 5.7 in the survey conducted between 1 and July 2.

Foreign tourists who came to the World Cup in Brazil approved the organization of the World Cup in general, as well as services rendered during the event, shows survey by Datafolha in survey of 2209 foreigners from over 60 countries at airports São Paulo, Rio de Janeiro and Brasilia, and Fanfests and local public high concentration in the cities of Belo Horizonte, Fortaleza and Salvador, and São Paulo, Rio de Janeiro and Brasilia. The interviews were conducted in English and Spanish between 1st and 11th July. This universe does not, therefore, represents the totality of foreigners present in the country. Besides the search profile of this audience, Datafolha also consulted his impressions about Brazil in general, and on the structure and organization of the World Cup, and the result is positive, both for the country and for the event.

The survey reveals that 83% of foreigners who came to Brazil rated as excellent or good the organization of World selections. For 12%, the organization, in general, was regular, to 3%, was poor or very poor and 1% could not answer.

In general, no differences of opinions about the organization of the World among foreigners. The only exception is the entres who live in Colombia, among these, 90% evaluate positively the organization of the event.

The organization of the World Cup and public safety surpassed the expectations of foreigners. Already, the opinions on urban mobility and the communication system of the country were divided. For the majority (60%), public security in Brazil was better than expected, especially among those living in England (72%). To 34%, which was within the expected, to 4% was worse (those who live in Mexico reaches 13%), and 2% did not know.

The organization of the Cup was better than expected for 51%, was from what was expected for 39%, and worse, to 8%. Among the foreigners living in Mexico was the biggest disappointment for the organization was 26% worse than expected.

Already, urban mobility was better than expected for 46% (among residents in Colombia reaches 57%), as expected for 40% to 11% and worst (among residents in Mexico reaches 25%). The system of communication (including telephone and internet access) was the most searched item divided reviews. For 24%, the

communication system exceeded expectations (those who live in Germany reaches 42%), who reported the same index that was worse (those who live in Colombia reaches 37% and among those living in Mexico, 36%) to 31%, was within expectations and 21% did not know.



Most watched (69%) at least one game in the stadiums. Of these, 22% reported that they had seen a game, 16% two, 12% three and 20% four or more matches. The average game in the stadium watched by aliens got in two games. Among the tourists who live in Germany, Australia, Mexico and Norway the average rises to three games (each). Aliens who have not attended any games at the stadium (31%), those living in Argentina stand out (including the rate reaches 48%). Less educated and younger women are more highlights - among these segments, respectively, 51%, 39% and 39% were not at the stadium to see a game.

Of the respondents who were to stadiums to watch at least one game, comfort and security were the top rated items surveyed, with 92% good or excellent (each).

The quality of transport to the stadium was also evaluated as well, with 76% approval. For 14%, the assessment was fair, 6% poor or very poor and 5% did not know. Among respondents who live in Colombia and Argentina, approval rates are higher and reach, respectively, 87% and 83%.

While the meals items in stadiums and arenas of communication system (including telephone and internet access) were the worst reviews, with approval rates of respectively 42% and 39%. The regular rate remained unchanged at 19% for both items, and the disapproval reached, respectively, 17% and 22%. These items had the highest rates of do not know, 23% and 20% of mentions.

The negative assessment of the communication system was highest among those living in Argentina, 29%. Already, the failure to meals served in stadiums is higher among those residing in the U.S., 26%. In general, those who negatively evaluate the overall organization of the World Cup, the failure of each item was above average.

During his stay in Brazil, seven in ten respondents (71%) did not witness protests against the sporting event. Noted that the demonstrations (29%).

When asked if they witnessed or learned of protests against the World Cup in the country, 63% said positive and 37% negative. Of those who witnessed or learned, 43% stated that the demonstrations were peaceful and that 19% were violent.

95% Approve of Brazilian Hospitality

Nine out of ten respondents are of the opinion that the Brazilian is friendly and responsive. To compare these data Datafolha prepared an evaluation index of nine items, whose objective was to measure the sentiment of the respondents with regard to Brazilian and services with respect to the country. The index is calculated by subtracting the rate of negative mentions (poor / bad) the rate of positive mentions (excellent / good) to avoid negative numbers sum up to 100 results. Indexes above 159 points and below are considered positive, negative.

Of the nine items surveyed, six foreigners were satisfied, especially the hospitality of the Brazilians, the best rated. The three items were disapproved those related to the cost of services.

The hospitality of the hosts reached 194 Cup points and has been rated as excellent or good by 95%. Came next, the quality of tourist attractions, with 183 points and a positive rating of 84% (among those who live in Colombia reaches 93%), the diversity of tourist attractions, with 181 points and a positive rating of 83% (between living in Chile reaches 91%), and safety, with 179 points and a positive rating of 82% (among those who live in Colombia is 88%).

Most tourists also positively evaluated the quality of air transport (172 points and 76% approval) and the quality of the hotel industry in the country (160 points and 64% approval).

The items cost the tourist attractions, cost of air transportation and cost of hotel system had positive ratings lower, respectively, 48%, 45% and 32%. Negatively assessed the cost of the hotel system 27%, the highest rate of all items, 18% the cost of air transport and 15% the cost of tourist attractions - among residents in Australia, 43% negatively assessed the cost of the hotel system.
