(South Korea) According to a survey conducted in South Korea, most respondents chose to avoid crowded places or to use online shopping as the biggest daily life changes caused by coronavirus (COVID-19). Around 42% of South Korean respondents stated that the president and the government of South Korea have reacted appropriately to the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. 74% of respondents in South Korea reported that they were concerned about getting infected by coronavirus (COVID-19).

(Japan) As of February 17, 2020, around 8% of Japanese respondents believed that the national government has overreacted to the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. On the other hand, approximately 47% of respondents stated that the government has not acted sufficiently. 55% of respondents in Japan stated that they had problems with a shortage of masks and disinfections they wanted to use at work. 20% Japanese respondents claimed that the virus outbreak had a major impact on their leisure travel plans, the lowest share among nine countries. (UAE) YouGov BrandIndex's latest data reveals Colgate enjoyed the greatest improvement in Ad Awareness of any brand during February. This success follows the launch of its new product, Natural Extracts toothpaste, containing activated charcoal and mint. In addition to the messaging around the Natural Extracts toothpaste, Colgate also released a health focussed animated video titled "Spread Smiles not Germs", which highlighted good hygiene practices and the suggestion one should purchase a new toothbrush once recovered from illness. 630-04 [GENDER EQUALITY POLL 2020](#) (Click for Details)

(Nigeria) More than 3 in 10 adult Nigerians indicated that there is gender equality in the country whereas majority of the respondents stated otherwise. Analysis by gender showed that there are more male (41%) than female (27%) respondent who mentioned that there is gender equality in the country. Regardless of previous response, respondents were asked: Do you think there should be gender equality in Nigeria? Ironically, the findings disclosed that a greater proportion of Nigerians (73%) believe that they should be gender equality in the country. As expected, there are more female (80%) than male respondents who believe that there should be gender equality in the country. (NOI Polls)

630-05 [Fast facts on how Greeks see migrants as Greece-Turkey border crisis deepens](#) (Click for Details)

(Greece) Greek authorities are attempting to prevent thousands of migrants from entering the country after Recep Tayyip Erdogan – the president of neighboring Turkey – said his government had “opened the doors” for their passage into Greece and, by extension, the European Union. The Greek government has taken a host of steps in response to Erdogan’s decision, including deploying forces to the border, suspending asylum applications and vowing to deport those who enter the country illegally. Some Greek residents, meanwhile, are taking matters into their own hands by forming civilian patrols aimed at stopping the flow of migrants. (PEW)

630-06 [Which corporate activities are most concerning to Brits?](#) (Click for Details)

(UK) In YouGov’s new white paper, Business ethics in Britain, we asked Brits to identify the most concerning activities engaged in by large companies. We also asked if they ever checked for evidence of any of these activities before making a purchase. Our research reveals that two-thirds of consumers (68%) are worried

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about profiteering, and that a similar proportion (67%) are concerned about companies that misrepresent product performance, companies that treat their employees poorly (65%), and companies that minimise their corporation tax payments (64%). 630-07 [Budget 2020: what tax changes would be popular?](#) (Click for Details)

(UK) This week's Budget has been overshadowed by the issue of the coronavirus, but despite that the new Chancellor will still have to make the usual decisions on taxes for the year ahead. In the run up to the Budget we looked at public attitudes towards the changes that the Chancellor could make. If the Chancellor has money to spend, the most popular tax reduction would be to cut council tax (picked by 36%), followed by income tax (29%) and fuel duty (22%). Three in ten reject any idea of tax cuts, and would rather the Chancellor spent any spare cash on public services. (YouGov)

630-08 [The London Mayoral Race: Sadiq leads the pack](#) (Click for Details)

(UK) Latest YouGov polling puts current Mayor Sadiq Khan well ahead of the competition. As the clock counts down to the 7th of May the various candidates running for London Mayor are stepping up their campaigns. However, polling of Londoners by YouGov shows Sadiq Khan having a 25-point lead over the competition. The latest voting intention figures show Sadiq Khan could secure just under half (49%) of first round votes, with Conservative candidate Shaun Bailey picking up 24% of the vote. Independent candidate Rory Stewart is currently polling at 13% of the vote. (YouGov)

630-09 [Four in ten British kids has their own tablet by age six](#) (Click for Details)

(UK) Most have to wait until age twelve to get their own computer or laptop however. YouGov research shows that 50% of Brits think parents or carers should prevent children spending too much time in front of screens. This may be a tricky job, though, as kids in Britain are getting their hands on their own devices from a young age. Most children in Britain have their own smartphones before they turn 12. In fact, 10% of six-year-olds already have one, and another 49% are allowed use of a family device. (YouGov)

630-10 [Most Britons still aren't scared about contracting coronavirus](#) (Click for Details)

(UK) The number of Britons scared about contracting the virus has increased to 38% but most of the population remains unconcerned. However, this figure rises to 45% of those aged over 65, who are most at risk from the disease. Since our previous wave (run between February 28th and March 1st) the number of people who have been following the key piece of government advice, to washing their hands more frequently,

is up from 35% to 61%. The number refraining from touching objects in public has more than doubled, from 14% to 30%. There has also been an increase in the number of people who are avoiding crowded places (up from 14% to 24%). (YouGov)

(UK) As the Labour leadership contest continues, each of the remaining candidates has seen a marginal increase in their name recognition but few still claim to know much about them. As the Labour leadership contest continues, each of the remaining candidates has seen a marginal increase in their name recognition but few still claim to know much about them. Keir Starmer remains the most well-known with nearly three in ten (28%) saying they know a great deal or fair amount about him (up 4% since late January). Just under one in four (23%) say the same about Rebecca Long-Bailey (up 4%) and fewer than one in five (18%) for Lisa Nandy (up 5%). (Ipsos MORI)

630-12 [As coronavirus spreads, which U.S. workers have paid sick leave – and which don't? \(Click for Details\)](#)

(USA) The bureau's 2019 National Compensation Survey (NCS) found that, for civilian workers, paid sick leave, while nearly universal at the upper ends of the wage distribution, becomes scarcer the less money one makes. For instance, 92% of workers in the top quarter of earnings (meaning hourly wages greater than \$32.21) have access to some form of paid sick leave, versus only 51% of workers earning wages in the lowest quarter (\$13.80 or less). Among the lowest-earning tenth – those whose wages are \$10.80 an hour or less – just 31% have paid sick leave. (PEW)

630-13 [Amid coronavirus threat, Americans generally have a high level of trust in medical doctors \(Click for Details\)](#)

(USA) The spread of the new coronavirus in the United States comes at a time of low public trust in key institutions. Only around a third of U.S. adults (35%) have a great deal or a fair amount of confidence in elected officials to act in the public's best interests, and fewer than half say the same about business leaders (46%) and the news media (47%), according to a January 2019 Pew Research Center survey. Public attitudes are substantially more positive when it comes to another set of participants in the unfolding coronavirus threat: doctors and medical research scientists. (PEW)

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630-14 [Majority in U.S. Still Say United Nations Doing a Poor Job \(Click for Details\)](#)

(USA) Although Americans' opinions of the job the United Nations is doing have improved, for the 18th consecutive year, more Americans think the U.N. is doing a poor job of trying to solve the problems it has had to face than say it is doing a good job -- 54% vs. 43%. Democrats remain more likely than Republicans to offer a positive job rating of the U.N. Despite the weak job assessment, 64% of U.S. adults continue to think the U.N. should play a significant role in the world. (Gallup USA)

630-15 [Americans' Approval of ACA Holds Steady \(Click for Details\)](#)

(USA) On the eve of its 10-year anniversary, the Affordable Care Act (ACA) -- signed into law by President Barack Obama on March 23, 2010 -- is supported by the slight majority of Americans, 52%. This has occurred only twice previously in Gallup polling on the ACA since 2012, both times in the early days of Donald Trump's presidency. Since Trump has been in office, the public has either tilted in favor of the ACA or been closely split. By contrast, from 2012 to 2016, attitudes more often tilted against the law. (Gallup USA)

630-16 [Democrats see Biden and Sanders as very different ideologically \(Click for Details\)](#)

(USA) Most Democrats and Democratic-leaning independents describe Sanders' political views as liberal (70%), including about half (48%) who say he is "very liberal." By contrast, Democrats are about as likely to describe Biden's views as moderate (31%) as they are to describe them as liberal (31%); 20% view Biden as conservative. About 15% of Democrats say they're not sure what Sanders' or Biden's political views are (14% and 16%, respectively). Uncertainty about their views is especially high among Democrats who are not following election news closely (31% for Biden, 25% for Sanders). (PEW)

630-17 [A majority of Americans continue to favor replacing Electoral College with a nationwide popular vote \(Click for Details\)](#)

(USA) A majority of U.S. adults (58%) say the Constitution should be amended so the presidential candidate who receives the most votes nationwide wins, while 40% prefer to keep the current system in which the candidate who receives the most Electoral College vote wins the election. Support for amending the Constitution has increased slightly since the period immediately following the 2016 election. In a November 2016 CNN/ORC survey, roughly half of adults (51%) favored amending the Constitution to eliminate the Electoral College. And in a March 2018 Pew Research Center survey, 55% favored taking this step. (PEW)

630-18 [About one-in-four Americans say they've had fewer advantages in life than others their age](#) (Click for Details)

(USA) Amid debates about the impact of privilege and inequality in the country, a Pew Research Center survey conducted in late 2018 asked U.S. adults how they would compare their advantages in life with those who are about their same age. Overall, 29% said they have had more advantages in life than others their age; 26% felt they have had fewer advantages; and 45% said they have had about as many advantages. Americans' assessments varied substantially across different groups. Race stood out as one of these demographic factors, with 42% of black Americans and 35% of Hispanics reporting they felt they have had fewer advantages in life, compared with 20% of white Americans who said the same. 630-19 [Banking apps more satisfying than branch visits](#) (Click for Details)

(Australia) As of January 2020, CBA was the strongest performer across the big four, recording satisfaction levels of 86.5% (branch banking), 91.7% (mobile banking apps), 89.3% (internet banking) and 77% (phone banking). NAB came in next with 84.2% (branch), 90.0% (mobile), 88.5% (internet) and 79.1% (phone). ANZ followed with 83.4% (branch), 88.9% (mobile), 88.1% (internet) and 77.0% (phone). Westpac rounded out the big four with 82.9% (branch), 87.9% (mobile), 88.6% (internet) and 76.5% (phone). (Roy Morgan)

630-20 [Gin and vodka drive spirits higher as other alcoholic beverages decline](#) (Click for Details)

(Australia) A total of 41% of Australians (an estimated 8,065,000 people) now consume wine in an average four week period and 37.4% (7,353,000) now drink beer putting these two types of alcohol well on top as Australian favourites. However, in contrast to other types of alcohol it is spirits which are a growing market and now consumed by 27.8% (5,465,000) of Australians, up from 26.4% (5,095,000) twelve months ago. All other alcohol types declined over the same period. The other types of alcohol in order of popularity are cider consumed by 11.3% (2,222,000) of Australians, RTDs (Ready-to-Drink pre-mixed spirit drinks) consumed by 10.7% (2,101,000), liqueurs consumed by 6.3% (1,240,000) and fortified wine consumed by 4.3% (850,000). 630-21 [Older people are more likely to live alone in the U.S. than elsewhere in the world](#) (Click for Details)

In the U.S., 27% of adults ages 60 and older live alone, compared with 16% of adults in the 130 countries and territories studied. In many countries in the Asia-Pacific, sub-Saharan Africa and the Middle East-North Africa regions – such as Afghanistan, Mali and Algeria – fewer than 5% of seniors live alone. U.S. adults ages 60 and older also are more likely than their counterparts around the world to live as a couple

without young children at home. Almost half of Americans in this age group (46%) share a home with only one spouse or partner, compared with three-in-ten globally (31%). Older adults in sub-Saharan Africa (9%) are especially unlikely to live in this arrangement. (PEW)

- 3- Number of **countries** covered by one or more surveys: \approx 178 during the period 2007-2014
- 4- Number **polling organizations** whose polls have been cited: \approx 358 during the period 2007-2014
